FROM THE FOUNDER

As I've been reading through Revelation with my small group, I've been reminded of how much God hates evil. He wants to take earth back. God is working, and that gives me hope.

The situation in Haiti has not improved much since I wrote to you last month. The gangs are increasing in size. Their reach is growing, too. In the last couple weeks, one of the gangs began taking over areas closer to our ministry compound in Onaville. Haitians are seeking refuge in Onaville, some of them have come to Pastor Poyis' church.

In fact, one woman named Aloure Inocent (pictured below) became a widow due to the gang violence. She sought refuge and medical care in Onaville. It was there that she found our Medical Clinic where she was treated for a stroke. She had nowhere to go, so Poyis brought her needs before the church. Immediately, a family from his church offered

to take her in. I am encouraged to see the church being the church, and I hope you are, too. Even in a season of instability and uncertainty, believers in Haiti, who have so little themselves, are caring for the widows and the orphans. It's stories like these that remind me of how God is working.

A new president will bring stability, but an election has to be held first. Please pray that an election will happen and a proper government will be put in place. Lord-willing, this will occur soon so we can resume visiting the ministry compound. We also hope to have a Starlink network in place soon at the ministry compound so we can have regular video calls with Poyis and other pastors in the Mercy Network. Even with a strong Wi-Fi network in place, Wiley and I still prefer to see our Haitian staff and pastors face to face.

Thank you for your continued prayers. When I think about your faithful friendship to the ministry, I am overwhelmed with joy.
