FROM THE FOUNDER

News from Haiti has been heavy and challenging over the last two weeks. On May 23, President Biden and President Ruto of Kenya publicly addressed their partnership in the United Nation's MSS mission to Haiti, stating that the first 250 Kenyan officers had already reached the country. However, the very next day, President Ruto shared with media outlets that it would be another three weeks



before the entire force would arrive in Haiti. To make matters worse, Kenyan officers completely pulled out of Haiti the next day, on May 25, claiming resources were critically lacking.

Sadly, on the evening of May 23, a young American couple, David and Natalie Lloyd, and Pastor Judes Montis on staff with Missions in Haiti, Inc. were violently attacked and killed by gang members. While heartbroken for the Lloyd, Baker, Montis and Missions in Haiti, Inc. families, our team continues to pray for these brothers and sisters in Christ. Natalie



Baker Lloyd was the daughter of a U.S. Representative for Missouri, so this story has had expansive reach throughout U.S. media outlets. I can only hope this helps spur the U.S. government to push for guicker action to help the people of Haiti.



Not even a week later, one of our own staff members was attacked and killed by a gang while he was en route to help Pastor Poyis with the kids. The plague of gang violence has only grown worse as the weeks go on. The violence and oppression by gangs in Port-au-Prince and the surrounding regions is causing further disintegration of the Haitian infrastructure. The growing concern is that many day laborers are not going out to work the fields, due to fear of losing their lives. If the fields are not worked, there will be worsened food shortages throughout the entire country.

I am thankful to report that the Lord has continued to provide for Poyis and the kids, as well as protecting them. However, my concern grows for them, especially knowing that the recent attacks and murders are taking place very close to their current place of residence. Opportunities for Poyis to move the children are very limited, as the gangs control any movement within or out of Port-au-Prince. Please continue to pray for Poyis as he leads and shepherds the children. I know this ongoing situation must be incredibly draining. Please continue to pray for provision of food, as it is becoming increasingly difficult for Poyis to get out and purchase food safely.

Poyis recently sent us some photos of the kids having a meal after their Sunday service. I was so grateful to see their smiles and am amazed at how much they have grown.











It doesn't seem like the people can wait another day for help, let alone another week. I can only trust that our God is still in control and has a plan.

I must ask you to keep praying fervently. Tomorrow, June 5, we will hold our monthly Day of Prayer for Haiti. I hope you'll join us in prayer as we seek the Lord for help (see below for ways you can participate). It is critical that we continue to pray. This is our biggest ask: pray.

While many non-profit organizations have completely pulled out of Haiti, Connect 2 Ministries remains committed and able to serve the Haitian people thanks to your faithful support. Thank you for standing with the Connect 2 team.



I want to share how desperate the situation in Haiti has become. We are nearing a critical moment regarding our people in Port-au-Prince. Popular media outlets are reporting that about 80% of the city is now controlled by gangs—but the reality is closer to 100%. The gangs control all roads coming in and going out. They control the port, they control the airport, and this oppressive power has created a city of civilians under siege. Virtually no resources are making it in, exwinedling. For our people for things ordered by the gangs. which means food options are dwinding, for our people are being choiced off. The crisis continues to worsen because, unfortunately, things are not changing quickly enough.

In light of all this, we are calling for another Day of Prayer for Haiti. We know we saying the same thing—it's bad, and it keeps getting worse. But that is the sad reality
